The 2007–2008 academic year was Corning Community College's 50th anniversary year and one of growth, opportunity and continued high quality of education and service.

We opened the Elmira Academic and Workforce Development Center providing the people of Chemung County with a unique educational and employment facility. This Center proved its merit in attracting new students and quickly filled to near capacity in twelve months of operation. Special thanks to the donors whose generosity gave the Center the resources to thrive in Elmira.

In the spring semester the College launched new degree programs including an A.S. in Fine Arts and Design that immediately attracted 28 students, as well as two programs specializing in Auto Body Repair. Our Advanced College Enrollment (ACE) program continues to grow. The program allows high school students to dual enroll in CCC classes as part of their high school curriculum thus efficiently garnering college credit and academic challenge.

The Theater Department debuted the original play, *Lonesome Drum, an American Tale* which was written and directed by faculty member Mary Guzzy.

CCC's student athletes continue to garner scholarships to transfer institutions, qualify for conference playoffs, and gain recognition as top competitors in both conference and national rankings. The annual Red Barons Classic Golf Tournament has raised \$95,000 over four years in support of our teams, thanks to strong community support for the tournament.

Of course, many of the good things that happen at CCC only happen because of private support. I thank you for your gifts to the College Foundation in support of scholarships, program development, and faculty enhancement.

New Scholarships

The **Doris A. Bovee Memorial Scholarship** was created in 2007 to support a woman interested in continuing her education at Corning Community College.

The **Waland Presidential Scholarship** was created through a gift from the estate of Thomas Waland, a former Corning Incorporated executive and area resident. Mr. Waland directed that a scholarship be created to assist a young person in attending CCC. The College president will select the recipient each year.

The **Gloria and Kenneth Matthews Scholarship** was created by their son in their memory. Gloria served as a Trustee of the College from 1976 to 1983. Both were well known area residents and champions for diversity and advancement. The scholarship will assist an African-American student studying at the College.

Salon Red

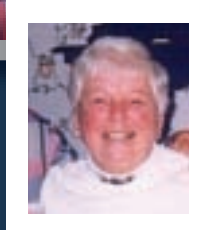

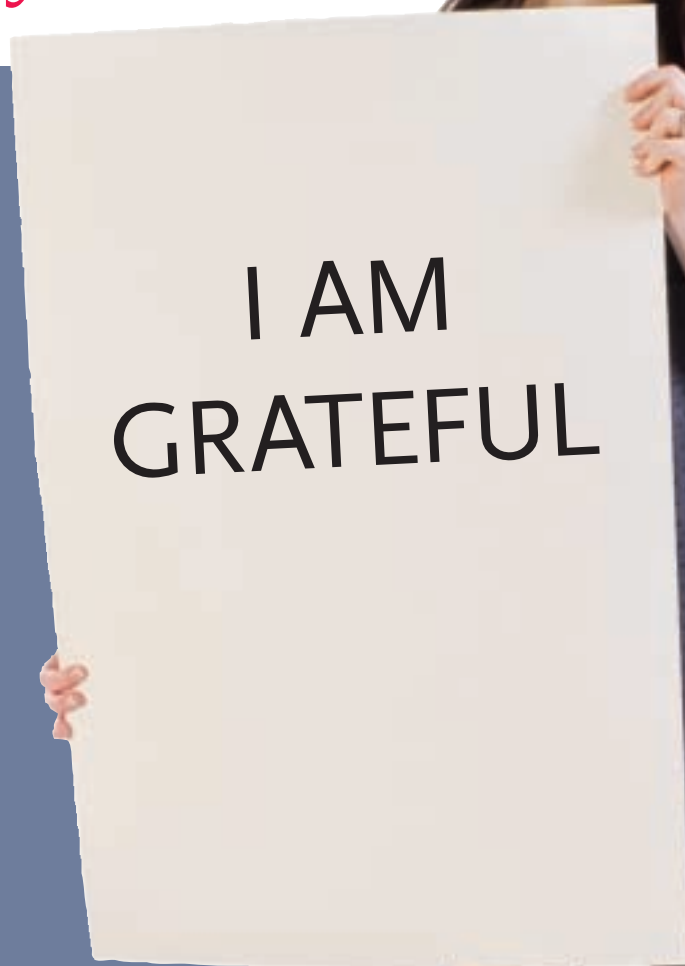
