



Checklist for Applicants to the AOMC/CCC/EMSTAR EMT: Paramedic program

The EMT: Paramedic program is offered jointly by the Arnot-Ogden Medical Center, Corning Community College and EMSTAR. Following acceptance to the program, students study emergency medical service courses at the EMSTAR center and general education courses at CCC. Students are eligible to apply for state and federal financial aid programs.

Some students in this program wish to be certified paramedics but do not plan to complete the requirements for the Associates in Applied Science degree. They must follow the steps outlined here even if they do not plan to complete the entire program. All participants will be full-time CCC students and must register for the paramedic courses through the College.

To be eligible to enroll in the paramedic courses required in this program, students must

- **Be at least 18 years old,**
- **Have a high school diploma or GED**
- **Be currently certified as a New York State EMT, (minimum one year preferred) and**
- **Be eligible to enroll in ENGL 1010 and MATH 1015 or successful completion of any remedial work required as a result of CCC assessment tests.**

1. Complete the Application for Admission to Corning Community College which can be found online at <http://www.corning-cc.edu/>. Simply click on the future students and families tab to access the application material.

- Contact your high school to request and official transcript be sent to CCC. (If you have a GED, also send a copy of your scores to the Admissions Office)
- Contact any previous colleges you attended to request an official transcript be sent to CCC.

2. Complete the AOMC/EMSTAR Application for Paramedic Training Program. Return this form in the envelope provided.

- Attach a copy of your current EMT card

3. Complete the AOMC/CCC Paramedic Program Health and Physical form and Release of Medical Records form. The original must be sent to the CCC Health Office and a copy to EMSTAR in the envelopes provided. *Students who have not submitted the*

Health form by the first day of class will not be allowed to continue.

4. Complete financial aid applications as soon as you can or 8 weeks prior to the start of classes if you plan to apply for financial aid. The Federal Financial Aid application is available on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) forms for NYS residents will be sent directly to you after the FAFSA is processed.

5. When you receive your acceptance letter from the CCC Admissions Office, call the student success center at 962-9434 or 1-800-358-7171, ext 9434 to make arrangements to take assessment tests and/or register for classes.
