Class List & Roster Verification

- Requires MyCCC account claim to access My Banner
- My Banner, Faculty & Advisors, Faculty SSB9, Class List
- Enrollment Count (doesn't look like a link, but it is)
- ACE Roster Verification




Enrollment in SUNY CCC ACE Class

- Students are enrolled in a SUNY CCC course if they are listed on the class roster in Banner, our student information system.
- The class roster must be verified by the ACE Instructor viewing the class roster.
- The ACE Instructor's roster verification is the class list.
- There is no other means of enrollment, regardless of who is physically present in the class.
- ACE students should claim their MyCorning account to verify their enrollment status in Banner.
- SUNY reporting and funding model do not accommodate retroactive enrollment

- Twin Tiers Arise Program (TTAP): July 2023 June 2028
- Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC)
- The Northern Tier Regional Planning & Development Commission is the lead.
- Career programming, course/s, and services to ACE students in New York and Pennsylvania
- Understanding Workplace Expectations (CRPL 1030)
- Career Exploration Workshops: identify strengths, anticipated lifestyle (values, income, work-life balance, location), explore career interests, regional employment projections, and develop post-high school plans

FYI: SUNY Reconnect

- Adult Learners 25-55
 - 25 by first day of semester
 - 55 on 1/1 of the enrollment year
- No prior college degree
- New York State resident
- Enrolled in high-demand field programs
 - Part time (at least 6 credits) or full time (12 credits)
- Eligible students are required to apply for TAP
 (NYS student aid) and should apply for federal aid (FAFSA)
- Covered costs: tuition, fees, books, and supplies
