Instructions to Accept/Decline your Financial Aid

Pell Grant and SEOG are federal grants that do not require "acceptance".

If you have been offered **Federal Work-Study and/or Federal Direct Loan**, you must accept or decline these funds. You can accept the full amount or a partial amount of the Federal Direct Loan. You may want to consider this when determining the amount of Direct Loan you will need for the academic year. In most cases there are additional requirements that you must complete for Direct Loan. Direct loan processing will be delayed if you fail to complete any additional requirements.

Step 2: Select "Student Resources" then "My Banner" My Banner"

Step 3: Select "Financial Aid"




Step 4: Answer the required questions from the Financial Aid Office. Select "View Questions".

- You may accept a partial amount or the full amount of Federal Direct Loan(s). If you are eligible for both Subsidized and Unsubsidized Direct Loan you must accept the subsidized loan before accepting the unsubsidized.
