Call for Presentations

The **New York State Cyber Security and Engineering Technology Association (NYSETA)** would like to invite you to share your professional expertise in your content area. Whether you are an exhibitor who wants to submit a paper/presentation or a faculty or graduate student who wants to have your work peer reviewed by content experts, you are welcome to submit your work. Your publication, if accepted, connects your paper with our vast community of students, faculty, administrators and vendors who specialize or who are interested in your specific field of study. Presentations and publications will be reviewed in advance for faculty who will be seeking credit towards their institution's scholarship requirements.

Topics can be in the technology areas of electrical, electronic, mechanical, manufacturing, civil, architecture, computer networking, computer systems design and operation, computer and network security, teaching and learning of technology and related areas. Material must be original, scientifically accurate, and in good form editorially. The paper should be informative, summarizing the basic facts and conclusions, and maintaining a coherence and unity of thought. Contributions may include research papers, case studies, tutorials, course or courseware experiences, evaluations, review papers, and viewpoints.

Presentations Coupled with Papers to be Formally Reviewed

Those requesting to give a presentation that relates to a paper to be formally reviewed should submit the paper in the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) format.

Each submission and any questions regarding formatting will be forwarded to the appropriate NYSETA Interest Group chair for consideration.

Papers should not exceed eight pages in length, not including the title page. Formal 200-word abstract submissions must be submitted via email to balke@corning-cc.edu no later than September 18th, 2017. The formal paper along with a Powerpoint presentation must be submitted by September 25, 2017. These will be presented as scheduled during one of the interest group sessions. Papers will be refereed and, if accepted, will be posted on the NYSETA website for a minimum of three years.

Presentations NOT to be Formally Reviewed

Presentations that will not be formally reviewed should present a cohesive and comprehensive focus on a topic relevant to the interest groups, categories or products described by this conference. Such presentations can be extended abstracts of approximately two to five pages (PDF or WORD format) or slide-shows (Powerpoint) showing the principal contribution of the presentation. These will be presented as scheduled during one of the interest group sessions. These must be submitted via email to balke@corning-cc.edu no later than by September 25, 2017. Each submission and any questions regarding formatting will be forwarded to the appropriate NYSETA Interest Group chair for consideration.

Additional Submission Guidelines

All presentations and associated papers should be submitted in electronic format via email, each as a single file.

Any email sent in reference to this conference must have "NYSETA" at the beginning of the subject field.

Please indicate in the email:

- (1) The anticipated length of the presentation. With the exception of the plenary session, all presentations will be, at the most, 50 minutes, including Q & A at the end of the presentation.
- (2) Which of the engineering technology categories (listed below) that the presentation should be considered in. If the topic spans over more than one, then indicate so.
 - Electrical/Electronic
 - Computer, Cyber Security and Information Technology
 - Mechanical, Automotive, Manufacturing
 - Civil, Architectural
 - Instructional techniques for technologies
- (3) Which submission category you would like it to be considered as:
 - Presentation coupled with paper to be formally reviewed (submit abstract, paper and Powerpoint presentation)
 - Presentation not to be formally reviewed (submit extended abstract or Powerpoint summary)
